The Guy Joseph Early Childhood Development Centres

Guy's Trust's first major project, in partnership with ActionAid, is the establishment of two 'Guy Joseph Early Childhood Development Centres' (ECDCs) in the impoverished Kaski region of Nepal, where Guy lived during the winter of 2010-11.

Guy's parents, Vicky and Tony Joseph and fellow trustee Lynne Gilbert have just returned from Nepal...

... "We met the community and stood on the land where, next April, 30 of us will start to build the first 'Guy Joseph ECDC'. A year ago we had a vision of what Guy's Trust might achieve; now we have seen that this vision will become a reality. We heard of the struggles of this dalit (untouchable) community and how the centre will improve their lives and we thanked the old lady who gave her land for the school. And we cried together - for our loss and then for the better future we are giving their children. An overwhelmingly emotional experience."
